With college looming in the future, many juniors are wondering if they should take a nationally administered ACT or just wait and take the free state-administered SAT. While this remains a personal decision, some juniors are choosing to take both. Students can then compare their results from the two platforms and decide which platform would be best for a potential retake! Below you will find a brief comparison of the two exams.

ACT: \$50.50 ACT + Writing: \$67.00
- ✓ Fee Waivers for 11th/12th grade students who qualify for free/reduced lunch
- ✓ Comprised of tests in the following areas:

English	45 Minutes/75 Questions
Math	60 Minutes/60 Questions
Reading	35 Minutes/40 Questions
Science	35 Minutes/40 Questions
Writing (Optional)	40 Minutes
- ✓ There are 4 subtests scored from 1 to 36
 1. English
 2. Math
 3. Reading
 4. Sciencewith a composite score between 1 and 36
- ✓ **NOT FREE**... ACT is no longer administered for free as part of the junior state assessment.

SAT: \$47.50 SAT + Essay: \$64.50

Reading	65 Minutes/52 Questions
Writing & Language	35 Minutes/44 Questions
Math (No Calculator)	25 Minutes/20 Questions
Math (With Calculator)	55 Minutes/38 Questions
Essay (Optional)	50 Minutes
- ✓ There are 2 sections scored from 200 to 800
 1. Evidence-Based Reading & Writing
 2. Mathwith a total score between 400-1600
- ✓ **FREE**...SAT with essay is the new test administered for free as part of the junior year state assessment and is scheduled to be given on April 9, 2019!
