## What's different and the same on the new eligibilitycenter.org website?

Our new website has the same purpose as our previous site: to gather academic and athletic participation information from college-bound student-athletes so we can evaluate their readiness for the college experience.

## I already registered with the NCAA Eligibility Center. How does the new website affect me?

- Your login credentials are still the same.
  - You can update your personal contact information if needed after you log in to the new site.
  - Your account, school and sport information will automatically transfer over to the new website.
- · You may receive new tasks to answer a few additional questions in the new website.
- For Fall 2017 enrollees, you can still request final amateurism starting April 1, 2017 once all your tasks are completed.
- 2017 winter/spring enrollees can still request final amateurism.

## What's new?

- My Planner is now your Dashboard.
- The Certification Process module helps you track your progress from registration, to test scores and requesting final amateurism certification.
- Improved Schools and Sports sections to simplify your registration.
- New layout and navigation to walk you through the registration process.
- The website is compatible with multiple devices.
- Help sections and FAQs on each page to answer your questions as you register.
- Two account types to choose from.
  - Certification Account: If you want to play at the Division I or II level you need to be certified by the NCAA Eligibility Center to compete at an NCAA Division I or II school. You also need to be registered with a Certification Account before you can make official visits or sign a National Letter of Intent in Division I or II.
  - Profile Page: If you plan to compete at a Division III school or are currently unsure which division you want to compete in, you can create a Profile Page. If you decide you want to play at the Division I or II level, you can transition to a Certification Account at any time and register completely to request final amateurism certification.
  - Please note: You can move from a Profile Page to a Certification Account, but not from a Certification Account to a Profile Page.
